


What is the difference between Mona and the Erasmus+ program?

The **Mona project** is a four-year initiative (2022-26) that aims to support a consortium of volunteer training centers (CFAs) wishing to offer mobility experiences to their apprentices. No funding for participants is provided as part of the project. The European Union's Erasmus+ program supports education, training, youth, and sport in Europe. It offers mobility opportunities for students, teachers, interns, and young professionals to study, train, volunteer, or work abroad. The program funds these mobilities by partially or fully covering participants' travel, accommodation, and living expenses, thus facilitating their participation without major financial constraints.



Together, let's open Europe to apprentices!



Founded by Jean Arthuis, former minister and MEP, our association aims to deploy the Euro App' "long term mobility for apprentices" experiment launched at the initiative of the European Parliament and piloted by the European Commission between 2016 and 2019.





How is my pay structured?

You can benefit from several sources of financial aid through your CFA (training center): Erasmus+ grants, OPCO funding, regional aid, and municipal aid. You may continue to be paid by your company. You should discuss this with your employer. Contact your CFA (training center) for assistance with the process.





Mona is an innovative France 2030 project

Mona aims to remove all obstacles to long-term European mobility by offering concrete solutions, notably through the funding of a full-time mobility advisor position in each CFA partnering with the project.

The consortium, led by the **Euro App Mobility association**, brings together 31 management organizations representing 43 volunteer CFAs and a government startup, *Diagoriente*. This project, planned to last four years, has a total budget of €25 millions, including €17 million in public funding from the government as part of France 2030.





Mona's ambition is to sustainably integrate longterm international mobility, lasting two months or more, into apprenticeship training programs. Workstudy students can also benefit from international experience during their training. The project's second objective is to welcome young people from outside France to train them for a few months. This will allow for more exchanges between professional training organizations around the world.











Within the **CFA LEEM Apprentissage**, the head of international mobility, Ms. Gabrielle Marie da Cunha, is in charge of representing the Mona project in France and abroad.

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
